General Description



From the administrative center of Vathy and the academic hub of Karlovassi, to historic Pythagoreion and traditional Marathokampos, the island's 33 settlements pulse with life and local character. This is the land where [Pythagoras](#), [Aristarchus of Samos](#), and [Epicurus](#) were born, and where, according to mythology, [the goddess Hera](#) chose to be "born" as well



At the point where Europe "touches" Asia, separated by only 1,300 meters at [the Mycale Strait \(Eptastadio\)](#), Samos stands as a geographical and cultural lighthouse.



For ultimate relaxation, Samos offers [Psili Ammos beach](#) (in the eastern part). There, the shallow, crystal-clear waters and fine golden sand create an exotic landscape, ideal for those seeking tranquility on a shoreline that gazes directly across at the coast of Asia Minor.

Top Attractions of Samos



 **Tunnel of Eupalinos:** One of antiquity's greatest engineering feats, this 6th-century BC subterranean, double-ended aqueduct stretches 1,036 meters in Pythagoreion. It is proudly listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. [\[1, 2 \]](#)



 **Temple of Hera (Heraion):** A UNESCO World Heritage monument comprising the archaeological site of Hera's sanctuary. Once the largest temple in Greece, it featured 155 giant columns, though only one stands tall today [\[1, 2\]](#)



 **Pythagoreion:** Built atop the ancient city of Samos, it encapsulates the island's entire culture. Highlights include the picturesque harbor with the statue of Pythagoras, the Castle of Lykourgos Logothetis, and the Pythagoreion Archaeological Museum. [\[1, 2\]](#)



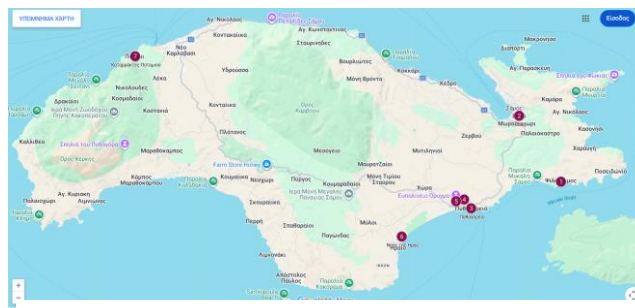
 **Ano Vathy:** One of the oldest settlements on the island, designated as a traditional village. It is famous for its narrow, uphill cobblestone alleys (kalderimia) and charming historic houses. [\[1, 2\]](#)



 **Monastery of Panagia Spiliani:** A unique church built inside a cave above Pythagoreion, offering breathtaking panoramic views of the coast. [\[1\]](#)



 **Potami Waterfalls:** One of the most fun and refreshing experiences in Samos! Reaching the large waterfall requires a bit of swimming. Make sure to wear water shoes or old sneakers, as the rocks can be quite slippery.

Archaeological Sites & Museums

Archaeological Sites



Tunnel of Eupalinos: One of the most significant engineering achievements of antiquity, this 6th-century BC subterranean double-ended aqueduct is 1,036 meters long and located in Pythagoreion. It is included in the UNESCO World Heritage List. [\[1, 2\]](#)



Temple of Hera (Heraion): The archaeological site of the Temple of Hera, a UNESCO World Heritage monument, was once the largest temple in Greece, featuring 155 giant columns, of which only one remains standing. [\[1, 2\]](#)



Castle of Lykourgos Logothetis: Built on a hill in Pythagoreion, next to the Church of the Transfiguration, offering panoramic views of the surrounding coast. It served as a base for the fighters of the Greek Revolution and now also operates as a museum. [\[1, 2\]](#)

Archaeological Museums



Archaeological Museum of Samos: Housed in two buildings, it features the famous Archaic Sculpture collection. The most important exhibit is the **Colossal Kouros**, standing approximately 5.50 meters tall and dating back to the 6th century BC. [\[1, 2\]](#)

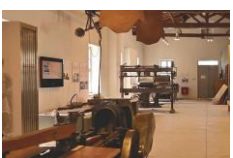


Archaeological Museum of Pythagoreion: Located in the heart of the ancient city of Samos, it houses over 3,000 artifacts showcasing the island's cultural evolution from the 4th millennium BC to the 7th century AD. [\[1\]](#)

Thematic & Natural History Museums



Museum of Natural History of the Aegean - Paleontological Museum of Mytilinioi: Features paleontological finds, such as fossils of animals that lived 3.5 to 7 million years ago (e.g., Samotherium). A famous exhibit is the "kaplani" (wild cat). [\[1, 2\]](#)



Tannery Museum (Karlovasi): Showcases the island's once-flourishing tanning industry. [\[1, 2\]](#)

Folklore Museums



Nikolaos Dimitriou Folklore Museum (Pythagoreion): A recently renovated museum (2023) presenting the daily life of Samians through tools, traditional costumes, and representations of old professions [\[1, 2\]](#)

Smaller folklore museums also operate in the villages of [Koumeika](#), [Pagondas](#), and [Mavratzaioi](#).

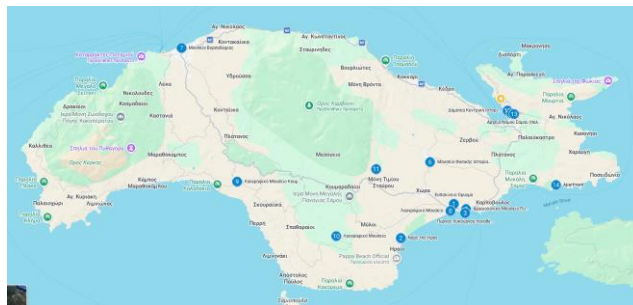
Historic Buildings



Public Central and Historic Library of Samos: Housed in a well-preserved neoclassical building on the waterfront, its operation dates back to 1850. Visitors can explore collections of rare editions, manuscripts, and significant historical and literary books.



Samos Historical Archives: Housed in the renovated old prison building of 1882. Thousands of handwritten books, files, documents, and collections from the 17th century are preserved here. Digital copies are available for researchers. The magnificent octagonal atrium hosts unique concerts and interesting lectures.

Religious Tourism



Ecclesiastical Byzantine Museum of Samos: Exhibits a significant number of Byzantine and post-Byzantine icons of high aesthetic and artistic value, parts of wood-carved iconostases (templa), sacred vessels, manuscripts dating back to the 10th century, incunabula, rare early editions, and codices.



Monastery of Zoodochos Pigi (or Ailiotissa): Founded in 1756 on the site of an older small church. The monastery's main church (Katholikon) was built in 1782 in the Byzantine style, featuring a dome supported by four columns which are said to have been transported from an ancient temple in Miletus.



Monastery of Agia Zoni (Vlamari): Located in a lush valley near Samos Town, this monastery was built in 1695 and features a beautiful garden and a serene environment. Its interior houses 17th-century frescoes and a remarkable library with patriarchal documents and precious vessels. [1]



Monastery of Agia Triada (Mytilinioi): The island's newest monastery (1824), featuring a magnificent marble iconostasis and a silver icon of Zoodochos Pigi. According to tradition, its dome is supported by columns from a building of ancient Samos.



Monastery of Panagia Spiliani (Pythagoreion): Perhaps the most unique spiritual site on the island, as the church is built inside a large cave. It offers breathtaking views of Pythagoreion and the Aegean Sea. [1, 2]



Monastery of Timios Stavros (Mavratzaioi): One of the oldest monasteries (16th century), known for its impressive architecture and the major religious festival held on September 14th. [1]



Monastery of Megali Panagia (Koumadaraioi): Founded in 1586, it is one of the island's wealthiest monasteries, boasting exquisite frescoes and a finely carved wooden iconostasis. [1, 2]



Monastery of Panagia Vrontiani (Vourliotes): The oldest monastery in Samos (1566), built at a high altitude with breathtaking views. Despite a devastating fire in the past, it has been exemplarily restored. [\[1, 2\]](#)



Church of the Transfiguration of the Savior (Potami, Karlovasi): Also known as "Panagia Potamiotissa." The marble columns supporting the dome likely originate from an ancient monument. Its construction reflects three distinct historical phases: Byzantine, Genoese, and modern.



Monastery of Zoodochos Pigi Kakoperato (Kosmadaioi): Located in a remote ravine at an altitude of 600 meters. The final 150 meters of the trail are difficult and precarious, as the path is carved into a steep cliff—hence the name "Kakoperato" (meaning "difficult passage"). [\[1\]](#)



Panagia Sarantaskaliotissa (Mount Kerkis): (Also known as Panagia Faneromeni) An impressive cave-church situated on the southeastern slopes of Mount Kerkis. The cave is also famously known as the "Cave of Pythagoras".



Monastery of Agios Ioannis Eleimon: Located on the southwestern tip of Samos, perched above a picturesque cove with views of the islet Katergo and the Fourni islands.



Panagia Makrini (Kallithea): A remote chapel built inside a cave above the village of Kallithea. In the past, the caves of this lush area served as a refuge for hermits and ascetics. [\[1\]](#)

- **Dress Code:** Entrance is permitted only with modest attire (long skirts/trousers and covered shoulders). Many monasteries provide wraps or shawls at the entrance for visitors.
- **Visiting Hours:** Monasteries are typically open to the public from **09:00 – 13:00** and **17:00 – 19:00**. They remain closed during the afternoon for the monks' and nuns' period of rest.

Wine Tourism & Wineries



Samos Wine Museum (UWC Samos): Housed in a 19th-century stone building in Malagari. It showcases the history of Samian winemaking through traditional tools and vintage photographs, while also offering wine-tasting sessions. [1, 2]



METAXA LIKNON: A model organic vineyard and hospitality venue located on the slopes of Mount Ambelos, near the village of Vourliotes. Pre-booking via the official [Metaxa](https://www.metaxa.gr) website is required. [1, 2]



Vakakis Winery (Karlovasi): One of the most popular wineries specializing in organic production. It offers wine-tasting packages and vineyard tours (booking is recommended). [1]



Nopera Winery (Καρλόβασι): Specializes in premium versions of the Muscat grape. Open to visitors only by appointment for private tours and tastings. [1]

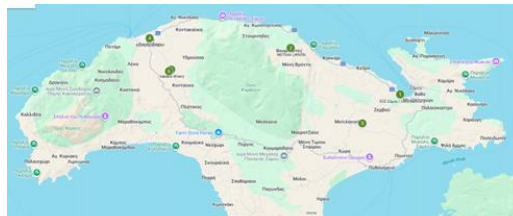


Hatziioannou Estate (Μυτιληνιοί): A centrally located, family-run organic winery. [1]



Kostaki Winery (Κοντέικα): A new organic winery (first vintage in 2023) focusing on modern winemaking techniques. Tastings are available by reservation only. [1]

Useful Tip: Before visiting the wineries, it is advisable to contact them in advance. Some venues require reservations, while visiting hours and tour prices may vary depending on the season.

Urban Centers, Villages & Settlements



Samos Town (Vathy): First inhabited in the early 19th century, it has been the island's capital since 1854. It is located in the northeastern part of the island, at the head of the large Gulf of Vathy. [1]



Ano Vathy: The oldest settlement of the capital, featuring narrow alleys, traditional tiled-roof houses, and post-Byzantine churches such as Ai-Giannakis. [1]



Pythagoreion: A historic seaside town in southeastern Samos, built upon the ruins of the ancient city. It is recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. [1]



Karlovassi: The second-largest town and the commercial hub of western Samos. It is a town with a rich industrial history, a vibrant student life, and unique natural landscapes. [1]



Mytilinioi: One of the island's largest villages, built amphitheatrically within a valley. It is home to the Natural History Museum, and local life revolves around the central square with its traditional cafes. [1]



Kokkari: An old fishing village that has evolved into a top resort without losing its traditional style. It is famous for its colorful houses situated right by the water's edge. [1]



Vourliotes: A 16th-century village surrounded by pine trees and Muscat vineyards. It stands out for its beautiful square and the nearby Vronta Monastery. [1]



Manolates: One of the most picturesque villages on the slopes of Mount Karvounis. It is famous for its narrow cobblestone streets, artistic galleries, and tavernas with panoramic views of the Aegean. [1]



Ambelos: Named after the vineyards (*ambelia*) that surround it. It offers stunning views and trails leading to small waterfalls and caves. [1]



Idroussa: A small but vibrant village that strongly preserves the elements of Aegean folk architecture and rural life. Despite its size, it stands out for its tranquility, hospitality, and traditional customs. [1]



Kosmadaioi: A quiet mountain village with stone houses on the green slopes of Mount Kerkis. From here, a dirt road continues to the Monastery of Zoodochos Pigi at Kakoperato, located in a lush ravine. [1]



Marathokampos: Built at the foot of Mount Kerkis, it retains its stone architecture with arches and fountains, serving as a gateway for visiting Pythagoras' Cave. [1]



Ormos Marathokampou: A picturesque fishing village with a beautiful harbor and natural beauty in the surrounding area. It attracts many visitors every year and is one of the island's most well-known tourist destinations. [1]



Platanos: One of the most beautiful villages in the Karlovasi region, built at a high altitude with vast views of Western Samos, Chios, and the Dodecanese. Surrounded by forests and vineyards, the village dates back to the early 17th century. [1]



Koumeika: A semi-mountainous village near Marathokampos, featuring a scenic square and a folklore museum. [1]



Pandroso: The highest mountain settlement in Samos. It is a quiet destination with lush nature and a strong traditional character, ideal for those seeking authenticity, seclusion, and a unique view of the Northern Aegean. [1]



Koumaradaioi: A village with a long tradition in pottery. Two of the most famous monasteries of Samos are located in the broader area: Megali Panagia (with remarkable icons) and Timios or Megalos Stavros (featuring an interesting iconostasis from 1845). [1]



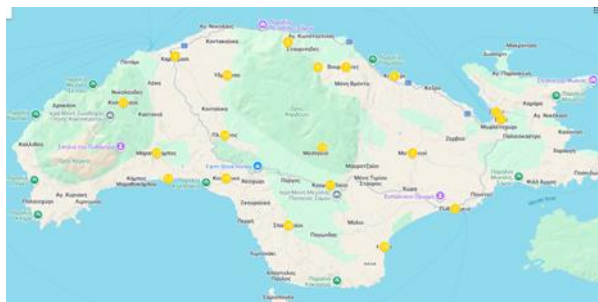
Spatharaioi: Located in the southern part of the island, this village is known as the "Balcony of the Aegean" due to its impressive panoramic views. It offers a unique vantage point towards the Dodecanese (Patmos, Lipsi), Fourni, and Ikaria. [1]



Heraion: A seaside village in southern Samos, famous for its picturesque fishing harbor and its immense historical significance. [1]

Guest Notes (2026)

- **Access:** The roads leading to the mountain villages (**Manolates**, **Vourliotes**) are winding, so careful driving is required.
- **Activities:** Many of these villages are interconnected by hiking trails that pass through lush green forests.
- **Reservations:** Especially for the popular tavernas in **Manolates** and **Vourliotes** during the summer months, contacting them in advance is highly recommended

Sea Excursions

From [Pythagoreion Port](#) (Departures between 09:00 and 10:30 AM):



 [Samiopoula](#): The most popular excursion. Traditional boats, such as [Captain Andreas](#), transport visitors to this small islet for swimming at the exotic "Psalida" beach, usually including a BBQ on nearby shores. [\[1\]](#)



 [Kasonisi](#) & Eastern Samos: Day cruises (e.g. with the boat "[Georgios](#)") to Kasonisi, a narrow passage with turquoise waters that resembles a natural lagoon. [\[1\]](#)



 [Kusadasi](#) (Turkey): Daily departures for Kusadasi and Ancient Ephesus. For 2026, scheduled routes are set to begin on **April 15th**.

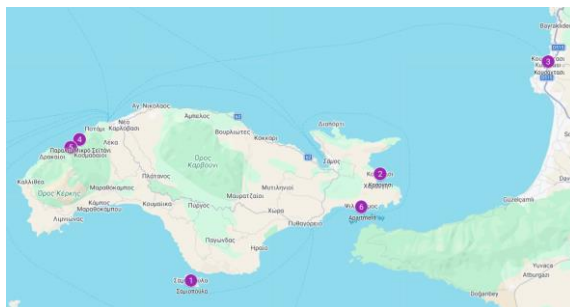

Hiking

Samos features an extensive network of over 240 km of marked trails, making it a premier hiking destination. The Most Popular Routes are:



Potami - Mikro & Megalo Seitani: The most iconic route. It starts from Potami (Karlovasi) and ends at two pristine Natura-protected beaches, accessible only by foot or boat.



Valley of the Nightingales: A lush green route connecting **Agios Konstantinos** with the mountain villages of **Manolates** and **Vourliotes**. It is famous for its dense vegetation and running waters.



Mount Kerkis (Vigla Peak): For experienced hikers. The ascent to the Vigla peak (1,434m) offers panoramic views of the entire Aegean. The classic climb starts from **Kamos Marathokampou**. It requires good physical condition and at least 5-6 hours of total hiking time.



Cave of Pythagoras: A moderate difficulty trail on the slopes of Mount Kerkis leading to the cave where the ancient philosopher sought refuge. According to tradition, the great philosopher and mathematician fled there around 530 BC to escape the persecution of the tyrant Polycrates

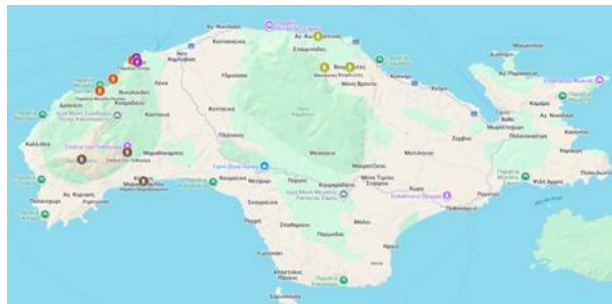


Potami Waterfalls: These offer one of the most fun and refreshing experiences in Samos, as reaching the large waterfall requires... swimming! Be sure to wear water shoes or old sneakers, as the rocks are slippery.

Organization & Maps

- **Official Network**: You can find detailed descriptions and maps for over 40 routes on **Samos Routes** website.
- **Organized Hikes**: **Samos Outdoors** offers daily organized guided tours with experienced escorts.
- **Equipment**: For most trails, sneakers or hiking shoes are sufficient, but for Mount Kerkis, hiking boots are required.

- **Ideal Period:** From **April to June** and from **September to mid-November**, when temperatures are mild.
- **Navigation:** For precise navigation, the hiking maps by [Anavasi](#) (1:45. 000 scale) or [Terrain Maps](#) (1:30.000 scale).

Nearby Beaches

Accessible by Car / Road-accessible



Mykali: One of the longest beaches (~3 km) with large pebbles and shallow waters. Partially organized, ideal for tranquility.



Klima: A quiet bay with crystal-clear waters and traditional tavernas.



Poseidonio: Picturesque, sheltered from the wind and family-friendly, featuring seaside tavernas.



Kerveli: A lush, verdant bay offering absolute serenity and natural shade from the trees.



Mourtia: Extremely picturesque with calm waters and dense vegetation. It has only a small canteen and remains authentic.

Access only by Boat or Hiking



Mikri & Megali Lakka: Secluded bays with deep waters, ideal for spearfishing. Accessible via a trail from Mourtia or by boat. Non-organized.



Kasonisi (The "Blue Lagoon" of Samos): An uninhabited islet separated from Samos by a narrow strip of turquoise, shallow waters. A completely pristine destination with no shade or facilities.

Large Supermarkets (Route to Samos Town / Vathy)



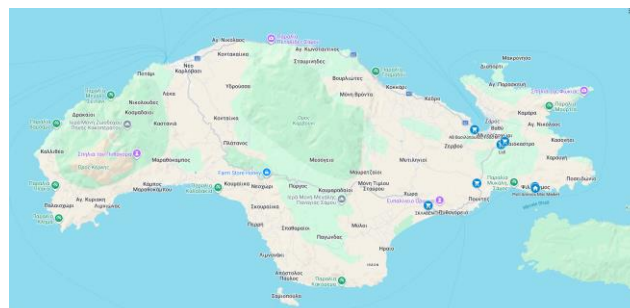
Known for its offers and an in-store fresh bakery. **(Distance: 7.3km)**
